Registration

Conference Location Sacramento, California

Sacramento is the capital of the third largest state in area and most populous in the nation. It was named after the river that forms its western border. The river was named by a Spanish Calvary officer for the Blessed Sacramento.

Home to 39+ million residents, the city is the sixth largest in California with nearly half a million people. It became a city through the efforts of John Sutter, a Swiss immigrant, who established Sutter's Fort in 1839. The Gold Rush of 1848 brought many social and demographic changes to the area with the influx of immigrants seeking riches. It was the terminal for many transportation - wagon trains, stagecoaches, riverboat and the First Transcontinental Railroad.

Visit Sacramento State University (the largest of 23 campus in the state system), University of the Pacific, and University of California, Davis. Take a tour of the Sacramento Underground or a ride on the river in a paddleboat steamboat. Visit four museums, pan for gold at one of five Sierra Gold Mines, enjoy the State Fair or shop till you drop at Arden Fair Mall with over 165 stores, restaurants, and eateries. The mall is across the street from the conference site--the Hilton Sacramento Arden West. The conference fee does not include the hotel lodging.
